Restaurant Revitalization Fund

This program provides emergency assistance for eligible restaurants, bars, and other qualifying businesses impacted by COVID-19.

Program Overview

Introduction

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) is awarding funding through the Restaurant Revitalization Program to restaurants, bars, and other similar places of business that serve food or drink. The purpose of this funding is to provide support to eligible entities that suffered revenue losses related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

On March 11, 2021, the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) became public law (P.L. 117-2). Section 5003 established the Restaurant Revitalization Fund (Fund) and appropriated \$28.6 billion for SBA to award funds. These appropriations remain available until expended.

To ensure that the smallest businesses and those in underserved communities receive funding awards, SBA has set-aside funds that are available only for certain applicants. For information on these set-asides, click here.

This program will provide restaurants who meet eligibility requirements with funding equal to their pandemic-related revenue loss up to \$5 million per physical location (not to exceed \$10 million total for the applicant and any affiliated businesses). The minimum award is \$1,000.

Funds must be used for "eligible uses" no later than March 11, 2023.

Eligible Entities

Generally, eligible entities include certain businesses who have experienced pandemic-related revenue loss and that are not permanently closed, and include businesses where the public or patrons assemble for the primary purpose of being served food or drink including:

- Restaurants
- Food stands, food trucks, food carts
- Caterers
- Bars, saloons, lounges, taverns
- Snack and nonalcoholic beverage bars
- Bakeries (onsite sales to the public comprise at least 33% of gross receipts)
- Brewpubs, tasting rooms, taprooms (onsite sales to the public comprise at least 33% of gross receipts)
- Breweries and/or microbreweries (onsite sales to the public comprise at least 33% of gross receipts)
- Wineries and distilleries (onsite sales to the public comprise at least 33% of gross receipts)
- Inns (onsite sales of food and beverage to the public comprise at least 33% of gross receipts)
- Licensed facilities or premises of a beverage alcohol producer where the public may taste, sample, or purchase products

To satisfy the statutory requirement for "place of business in which the public or patrons assemble for the primary purpose of being served food or drink," an eligible entity must have at least 33% in 2019 on-site sales to the public.

The original business model of eligible entities that opened in 2020 or that have not yet opened should have contemplated at least 33% of gross receipts in on-site sales to the public.

Those entities without additional documentation requirements, such as restaurants and bars, are presumed to have on-site sales to the public comprising at least 33% of gross receipts in 2019.

All applicants must attest in the application to the following: "The Applicant is eligible to receive funding under the rules in effect at the time this application is submitted."

Eligible entities include any of the above entities located in an airport terminal or that operate independently (i.e. has its own tax identification number) inside another business (e.g. a restaurant that operates independently inside a hotel or conference center) or that are a Tribally owned concern.

How to Calculate Funding Amount

Calculation 1

For Applicants in operation prior to or on January 1, 2019

- 1 2019 Gross Receipts minus
- 2 2020 Gross receipts minus
- PPP Loan AmountsFunding Amount

Calculation 2

For Applicants that began operations partially through 2019

- (Average 2019 Monthly Gross Receipts x 12)
- 2020 Gross receipts minus
- 3 PPP Loan Amounts= Funding Amount

Calculation 3

For Applicants that began operations on or between January 1, 2020 and March 10, 2021 and

Applicants not yet opened but have incurred eligible expenses

- 1 Amount spent on <u>eligible</u>
 <u>expenses</u> between
 February 15, 2020 and
 March 11, 2021
 minus
- 2 2020 Gross receipts minus
- 3 2021 gross receipts (through March 11, 2021) minus
- PPP Loan Amounts
 = Funding Amount

Important Note

For those entities who began operations partially through 2019, you may elect (at your own discretion) to use either Calculation 2 or Calculation 3.

Maximum and Minimum Amounts

SBA may provide funding up to \$5 million per location, not to exceed \$10 million total for the applicant and any affiliated businesses. The minimum award is \$1,000.

How to Calculate Funding Amount

Calculation 4

For Applicants that operate multiple locations using different Calculations

Applicants that operate multiple locations may calculate funding amounts for their locations using separate calculation methods and then aggregate the amounts together. The aggregated funding amount is limited to \$5 million per location and \$10 million for the Applicant and its Affiliates.

Example

An Applicant owns a restaurant that has been open since 2015 and another restaurant that has been open since 2020. The Applicant may use Calculation 1 for the first restaurant and Calculation 3 for the second restaurant. List the aggregated funding amount in Table 4 of the application and indicate how many locations are used in the calculation.

Example

A food truck operator has 5 food trucks. Three food trucks have been in operation since 2015, one began operating in 2020, and one has been purchased but is still in the process of being made ready for use. A food truck operator has only one location (the business headquarters), so the food truck operator would use Calculation 1 for the calculation because the business first began making sales in 2015.

The Application Process

Step 1

Complete an application with Lendistry.

Step 2

After you submit a completed application, you will receive an email from Lendistry containing your username to the SBA portal, where you will upload required documents based on your award calculation. Use your assigned username to login and reset your password.

Step 3

Once logged in, you can review your application, which will be auto-populated from Step 1. You will not need to reenter your information. Continue through the SBA application process to check that the information you provided in the Eligibility, Business Details, and Award Calculation sections are correct.

Step 4

In the **Deposit Account** section, link your bank or manually enter your information to set up an ACH for a direct deposit of funds. Your bank information will be reviewed to confirm the account is attached to the applicant.

Step 5

Upload all required documents in the **Supporting Documents** section.

Step 6

The SBA will review your application and all supporting documents. If there are any missing items or issues with your application, the SBA will reach out to you directly.

Step 7

Once you are approved by the SBA, you will receive the grant money via ACH to the account identified in Step 4.

Required Documents

Applicants that were in operation prior to or on January 1, 2019 must supply, at the time of application, documentation of gross receipts for 2019 *and* 2020;

Applicants that began operations partially through 2019 and use calculation 2 must supply, at the time of application, documentation of gross receipts for 2019 *and* 2020.

Applicants that began operations partially through 2019 and use calculation 3 must supply, at the time of application, documentation of gross receipts for 2020.

Applicants that began operations on or between January 1, 2020 and ending on March 10, 2021 <u>and</u> Applicants that have not yet opened as of March 11, 2021, but have incurred eligible expenses, must supply, at the time of application, documentation of gross receipts and eligible expenses for the length of time in operations.

For the purposes of this program, gross receipts do not include:

- Amounts received from Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans (First Draw or Second Draw)
- Amounts received from Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL)
- Advances of EIDL (EIDL Advance and Targeted EIDL Advance)
- State and local grants (via CARES Act or otherwise)
- SBA Section 1112 payments
- Randolph-Sheppard Act Financial Relief and Restoration Payments (FRRP) Appropriation
- Taxes collected for and remitted to a taxing authority if included in gross or total income, such as sales or other taxes collected from customers (this does not include taxes levied on the concern or its employees)
- Proceeds from transactions between a concern and its domestic or foreign affiliates
- Amounts collected for another by a travel agent, real estate agent, advertising agent, conference management service provider, freight forwarder or customs broker

Required Documents

- 1. For <u>all Applicants</u>, the following documentation is required:
- i. **The Application: SBA Form 3172** (completed, initialed, and signed). Completion of this form digitally on the SBA Platform will satisfy this requirement.
- ii. Verification for Tax Information: IRS Form 4506-T, completed and signed by Applicant. Completion of this form digitally on the SBA Platform will satisfy this requirement.
- iii. **Gross Receipts Documentation:** Any of the following documents demonstrating gross receipts and, if applicable, eligible expenses:
 - Business tax returns (IRS Form 1120 or IRS Form 1120-S)
 - IRS Form1040 Schedule C; IRS Form 1040
 Schedule F
 - For a partnership: partnerships IRS Form 1065 (including K-1s)
 - Bank statements
 - Externally or internally prepared financial statements such as Income Statements or Profit and Loss Statements
 - Point of sale report(s), including IRS Form 1099-K.

- 2. For Applicants that are a brewpub, tasting room, taproom, brewery, winery, distillery, or bakery: In addition to the documents in (1) above, documents evidencing that onsite sales to the public comprise at least 33.00% of gross receipts for 2019, which may include Tax and Trade Bureau (TTB) Forms 5130.9 or TTB. For businesses who opened in 2020, the Applicant's original business model should have contemplated at least 33.00% of gross receipts in onsite sales to the public.
- 3. For Applicants that are an Inn: In addition to the documents in (1) above, documents evidencing that onsite sales of food and beverage to the public comprise at least 33.00% of gross receipts for 2019. For businesses who opened in 2020, the Applicant's original business model should have contemplated at least 33.00% of gross receipts in onsite sales to the public.

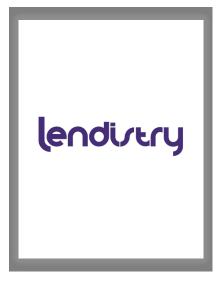

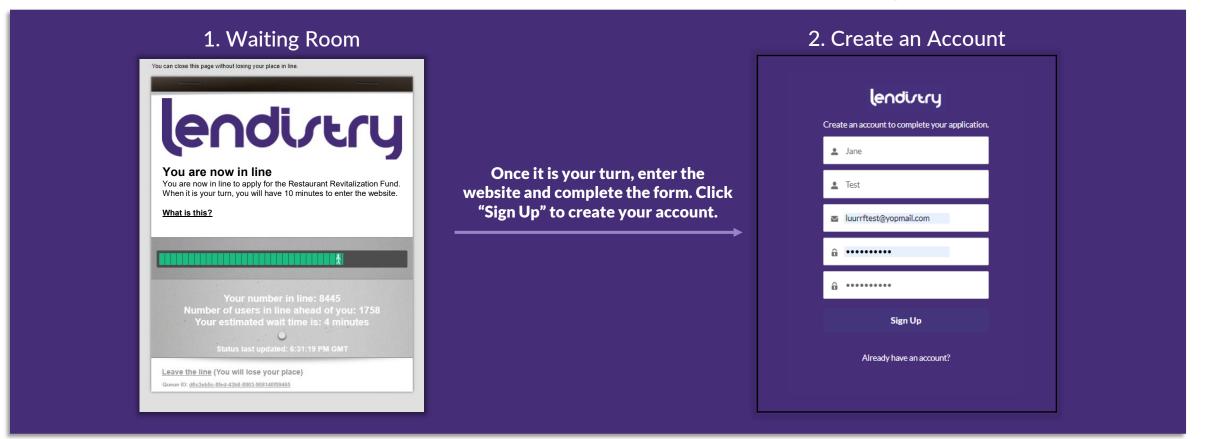

Getting Started

Instructions

1. Visit https://lendistry.com/restaurantrevitalizationfund/ to review the program guidelines and access the application. You will be redirected to a waiting room. Once it is your turn, enter the website and complete the form. Click "Sign Up" to create your account. Please be sure you spell your email correctly and make note of it. If you do not remember your email, we will not be able to retrieve your application and you may have to submit a new application. However, applying multiple times can be flagged as fraud and delay your application process.






How to select your restaurant type:

- 3. Click the right arrow to move your restaurant type to the box labeled "Chosen".



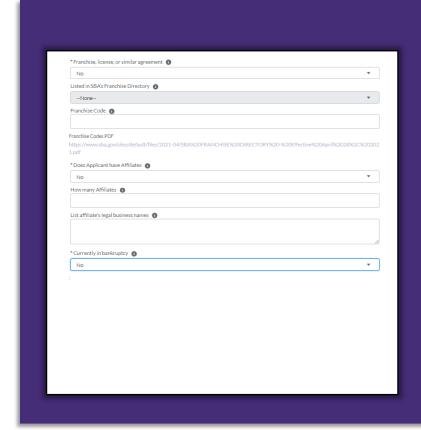



Priority in Awarding

Information Needed

1. Priority in Awarding Restaurant Revitalization Funds: In accordance with the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, SBA will prioritize awarding funds to Applicants that are small business concerns at least 51 percent owned and controlled by individuals who are women, veterans, and/or socially and economically disadvantaged individuals. Applicants in one of these categories that are operating under an approved plan of reorganization under either a Chapter 11, Chapter 12 or Chapter 13 bankruptcy and do not have a trustee exercising day-to-day control are eligible for funding under this program.



SBA will prioritize awarding funds to small businesses at least 51 percent owned and controlled by individuals who are:


- women, or
- veterans, and/or
- socially and economically disadvantaged individuals
